

From the Pastor's Desk



How did you get through that giant wind storm from a couple of weeks ago? Did you have any property damage?

We had a couple of small things that we had to take care of, then a couple of days after the storm, we noticed that the 4x4 foot egress window in the closed-off mechanical room of our basement had blown in! The whole window, frame and all! That window is mostly below grade with a large window well around

it. That must have been some strange wind to blow it in!

The wind can be very powerful! I am grateful that it didn't do more damage, that we didn't have a tornado, and that we don't live where there are hurricanes.

The wind can also be helpful, drying clothes on a clothesline and turning turbines to create electricity. It can also be lovely, blowing leaves gently and creating a cooling breeze on a hot day.

In the Bible, the Hebrew word for "wind" is the same word as "spirit," including the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit can be gentle and lovely, helping us to feel warm, cared for, and loved by God. The Holy spirit can be helpful, strengthening us to do important work in loving people. The Holy Spirit can also move powerfully. It was the Holy Spirit's power that raised Jesus from the dead. We are praying for that power of the Holy Spirit to do miracles in our church and in our lives.

Have you prepared yourself for that power? If you are praying our Breakthrough Prayer and really mean it, the Holy Spirit power my come with a jolt!

Keep praying our Breakthrough Prayer! We will have a marvelous April. There will be fun activities along with the Cantata, Holy Week and Easter. Through all of it, keep praying that Breakthrough Prayer! Things have been bubbling. Let's see how strong of a Holy Spirit gust will come our way!

Appreciated stock, securities, or other assets	Donate stock, securities, or mutual fund shares through the Foundation at no fee.	An income tax deduction and avoidance of capital gains tax. This allows you to make a larger gift than if you made it with cash.
Direct gift of up to \$108,000 from Traditional or Roth IRA	If you're 70-1/2 or older, ask your IRA administrator to make a gift directly to the church or another charity from your Traditional or Roth IRA.	You can make a generous gift that is tax-free and can count for the mandatory minimum withdrawal from your IRA. 

Sleeping Mat Work Days

It has been a year!! April 17th was the first time that people started to weave sleeping mats at a circle meeting and our first mat was completed May 7th. 17 sleeping mats have been completed at the time writing this article.

Many, many people have been involved in this project. A LOT of learning and work has happened since then. People have:

- t cut and looped many bags
- t discovered and tweaked new ideas to help us
- + added a second loom
- † saved bags
- t old their friends about the project.

We now have people involved in our church who weren't before. They are saving bags for us and coming to weave with us. People have been served who do not have a bed at night with a small bit of comfort and protection. Sleeping mats have been given to Stateline Works of Mercy, Salvation Army, 1st UMC in Appleton and have some yet to give. We are excited to start our next year of weaving. Would you like to join us? We work from 9:30-11:30. You can come anytime during that time slot. There are several jobs and you can choose what you'd like to learn to do. Do you want to weave before or after worship on Sunday? Ask any of the current weavers to get you started if you don't know what to do.

LOOSE COINS

April -- Caritas

April Loose Coins will go to Caritas, the community resource center founded 50 years ago by several Beloit churches, including ours. Caritas offers the largest food pantry in the area, as well as a diaper pantry and community garden, serving families in the entire state line area.

Our Caritas representative, Pat Sands, reports that collections are coming in, but the needs are always great. Caritas serves over 700 families per month, providing healthy food offerings like fruits and vegetables, whole grains, and a variety of protein sources. Families can access the food pantry and the diaper pantry twice a month.

Soon the community garden program will start up for the year. It provides seeds, plants, tools, and training, along with a plot in the community garden so that families can learn how to provide their own food.

May -- Conference Ingathering for Midwest Mission

Just a heads up for May.

During the month of May we will be collecting both Loose Coins donations and toiletries items for the Conference Ingathering, to benefit Midwest Mission.

The Ingathering is a collection sponsored by the Wisconsin Annual Conference to aid a charity selected by the Conference. They have chosen Midwest Mission again this year. Each church is asked to collect cash and in-kind donations in May and deliver them to Annual Conference in early June.

We will be collecting toiletries items for the Personal Dignity Kits that Midwest Mission sends out. More information will follow in the May Current, but you may remember the usual items: hand towel, washcloth, single tooth brush, single bar of soap, shampoo, deodorant, lotion.
