From the Pastor's Desk...



The average person loses between 50 and 100 strands of hair every day. When your hair is longer, you notice that hair loss more than when your hair is shorter. Because my hair is longer, I occasionally notice something interesting. Recently I noticed a hair that was about 6 inches of gray, with the rest brown.

For pastors, everything can become a sermon illustration, so I thought about that two-toned hair and how it can illustrate our faith.

I thought about the follicle that hair came from. When that hair had grown to about 10 inches, the melanin was used up (or whatever happens to the melanin). But the follicle didn't stop growing hair. It just stopped having color. The situation for that hair follicle changed, but it kept doing its job.

Throughout our lives we encounter situations that change everything - we age and can't do the same things we did when we were younger. We or someone we love becomes chronically ill. We retire or lose a job. We lose a friend, or we find ourselves in an estranged relationship, or we lose a loved one. Perhaps a bad decision was made, or we are misunderstood. Sometimes life can feel overwhelming.

In those difficult times, God continues to be with us. How we are able to move forward and what we are able to do may be different, but with God's help we are able to continue with God's purposes for our lives. We do this as long as we live.

Whatever you are going through right now, know that God is with you. Know that you have a church family walking alongside you. Life may not be the same "color," but it can be every bit as much beautiful -perhaps even more so, as you grow in new ways.

Coming June 23!

Sunday during worship: the Band will lead worship, playing civil war era instruments and focusing on the history of hymns. It should be very interesting and meaningful worship.

Sunday Afternoon: There will be a concert on the church grounds at 2:00 pm.

In 1864 eighteen men from the Brodhead Brass Band enlisted in the Union Army as the band of the 1st Brigade, 3d Division, 15th Army Corps. They left their rural homes to participate, under the command of General William T. Sherman, in the campaigns of Northern Georgia and the Carolinas. The "Tradition of Excellence" that these men established, more than 130 years ago lives on today with the members of the 1st Brigade Band.

The band MAKES HISTORY LIVE by presenting period brass band music, performed on antique instruments. Attired in uniforms and gowns, the Band's musicians, color guard, and costumed ladies take you back to the 1860's; to that turbulent era known as the Civil War. A nostalgic portrayal of the atmosphere of days gone by is generated by a unique form of showmanship that blends the sights and sounds of the period with historical anecdotes.

More than eighty volunteers, men and women, make up the 1st Brigade Band. Widely varied in age and occupation, they come from many communities, bringing with them a common interest in their musical heritage. During a typical year, they will meet their audience more than forty times, in concerts, parades, military balls, and worship services, presenting their educational and entertaining programs. While the abundant written and pictorial materials remain, the mellow sounds of the brass bands of the 1860's were lost until the 1st Brigade Band, starting in 1964, began to locate and restore the dented and broken instruments and to retrieve and reconstruct the yellowed and torn music. Through their work you can now hear what Presidents Lincoln and Davis, Generals Lee and Grant, and their contemporaries heard.

1st Brigade Band has a collection of 240 instruments, all made before 1865, and their collection of sheet music of the civil war era, numbering 690 titles.

We hope you will come and enjoy this wonderful opportunity!

LOOSE COINS

Our **June** Loose Coins offering will go to **Rock Valley Community Programs**, Inc. (RVCP), a non-profit agency serving the Rock County area that encompasses several different residential and outpatient programs.

RVCP programs assist homeless veterans, people transitioning from the correctional system, and clients dealing with addiction or mental health issues. The common denominator in all the programs is a recognition that clients' life complications develop out of complex paths. Treatment involves compassionate, inter-disciplinary approaches aimed at restoring them to fully human beings, able to transition into independent living.

Here are some of the RVCP programs our donations will support:

- •Housing 4 Our Vets -- a residential program housing 96 male veterans referred and approved by the Veterans Administration. Veterans are allowed to stay for up to 24 months as they receive addiction and mental health treatment and supportive services to prepare them for independent living and employment.
- •Residential Re-entry Program -- a 100-bed residential program assisting adult male and female residents transitioning from prison back into the community. They provide support for educational advancement, obtaining stable housing, and medical/treatment services.
- •Compass Behavioral Health Clinic -- a state-certified outpatient clinic within RVCP for substance use disorder and mental health treatment. Treating adults, adolescents, and children, the clinic offers individual and group therapy, psychiatric services, and comprehensive behavioral health treatment.

The services of Rock Valley Community Programs are in many cases a lifeline to those who were at the end of their rope, people who were among "the least of these." The agency is committed to transforming lives, through compassion and professional care. Let's give generously and support this vital mission!

















A Look Ahead: Blest Art





Over \$100 billion would still be left for additional ministry expansion.
