From the Pastor's Desk



For me, there's something about water.

As I write this I am on vacation in Sister Bay, Door County. I am currently inside, looking out of the window at Sister Bay (the water). There is a flock of geese floating by. An occasional boat goes by on its way to Green Bay (the water). But I mostly just like looking at the water. It's a bluish gray right now, because it's mostly cloudy. Yesterday, when the sky cleared, it was the most brilliant blue. When I am finished writing, I will go down and sit by the water, listening

to the small waves lap against the rocks and shore. I will spend time there reading my Bible and praying. It is precious.

Each January, Dan and I take a vacation to South Florida. The best part of that time is sitting by the ocean. The waves are a powerful reminder of the strength and love of God. I have had a fountain in my back yard for over 20 years. Last year Dan decided to put in a very small pond with a fountain instead. It makes much more water noise, which I love. I regularly sit by it. Best of all, I can hear it as I fall asleep if the window is open.

For me, there is something about water. It is sacred. It is a sight and sound where I experience the holy. I breathe more slowly and more deeply. The burdens of life wash away. For that moment of time, I am content to simply exist as a child of God. For me, there is something about water.

What is it for you? What do you experience that immediately makes you feel closer to God? Is it your flower garden or the tree in your backyard? Is it digging in the dirt, planting and harvesting? Is it walking the golf course or walking in the forest? Is it staring into your fireplace? Is it staring into the starry sky?

If you are thinking that you do not have a "there's something special about" place or activity, spend some time paying attention to the different places and activities of your life. Is God strongly there and you hadn't even noticed?

My prayer for you is that you know the incredible love that God has for you, and that you are living God's beautiful purpose for your life. And that you regularly take quiet time, just you and God, where you experience confluence moments, because that is what this is!





JUNE LOOSE COINS

Rock Valley Community Programs (RVCP)

Our June Loose Coins offering will go to **Rock Valley Community Programs**, Inc. (RVCP), a non -profit residential facility located on Riverside Drive between Beloit and Janesville. RVCP's core mission is to provide (1) supportive transitional housing and (2) addiction and mental health treatment programs to its target client groups.

There are three target groups: homeless male veterans, men and women transitioning from the criminal justice system, and people in the general public needing outpatient addiction or mental health treatment.

The common denominator in all the programs is a recognition that clients' life issues develop out of complex paths. Treatment involves compassionate, inter-disciplinary approaches, and the goal is to restore them to fully human beings, able to transition into independent living.

Here are some of the RVCP programs our donations will support:

- <u>Housing 4 Our Vets</u> -- a residential program housing 96 male veterans referred by the Veterans Administration. Veterans are allowed to stay for up to 24 months as they receive addiction and mental health treatment and support to prepare them for independent living and employment.
- <u>Residential Re-entry Program</u> -- a 100-bed residential program assisting adult male and female residents transitioning from prison back into the community.
- <u>Compass Behavioral Health Clinic</u> -- a state-certified outpatient clinic for adults, adolescents, and children, treating substance use disorder and mental health.

RVCP is committed to transforming lives, through compassion and professional care. The services they provide are in many cases a lifeline to people who were at the end of their rope, people who were among "the least of these." Let's give generously and support this vital mission!
