## **MCCI UPDATE**

#### **Missional Church Consultation Initiative**

At the November pastor training, the MCCI pastors learned about Conflux Moments. Before you completely tune out because you've never heard of a conflux, at River of Life, we are changing the name of them to CONFLUENCE MOMENTS. It turns out that a conflux is another word for confluence – and we know what a confluence is! We have one just over the state line into South Beloit – where Turtle Creek and the Rock River flow together.

A Confluence is a place where two rivers flow together. For our purposes, a Confluence Moment is when our spirit and God's Spirit flow together in such a way that we are certain that we have had a divine-human encounter. It is the unmistakable reality of God's presence.

As we continue to worship and pray, as we continue to pray our Breakthrough Prayer, we should be expecting to have Confluence Moments. We should be expecting to feel our spirit flowing with God's Spirit in new ways. We should be expecting to feel an unmistakable reality of God's presence. Expecting.

Too often, as church members, we sleep through our days. We cannot make a Confluence Moment happen, but we can put ourselves in a place to notice them. It is that experience that helps us to awaken, spiritually.

Advent seasons tend to go by in a blur. It is a very busy time. Make sure you are carving out some time for you and God. Make sure you are putting yourself in places where it is easy for you to connect with God. Watch for those special times when your spirit and God's Spirit flow together.



#### **Loose Coins**

Loose coins for December will be divided between **Northcott Neighborhood House** and the **Salvation Army**.

Northcott Neighborhood House is a multi-program community center in Milwaukee established by the United Methodist Church in 1961. From its modest beginnings providing food, clothing, and family support out of an old house, it has grown to occupy several modern buildings. Its many programs include teaching job skills, providing employment opportunities, and assisting with basic food and clothing needs, as well as providing recreational and community meeting space.

In addition, Northcott offers educational programs for all ages, with GED, literacy, Head Start, and after-school programs held at locations around the city of Milwaukee. Northcott serves one of the most segregated cities in the nation with community-building support for youth, families, and senior citizens.

Closer to home, the Salvation Army of Rock County includes both the Janesville and Beloit locations. In Beloit, the Red Shield Center at 528 Broad St., offers community meals on Tuesday and Thursday and a food pantry Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. Social services are available by appointment on Wednesdays, and those wishing to attend Sunday church services may ride a shuttle to the Janesville center. Our donations to the Salvation Army remain in the community and help meet the critical food insecurity needs in the Stateline area.


# Core Strength & Balance



### **Rice Meal Pack Event!**

On September 7<sup>th</sup> a number of us went from River of Life to Sugar River UMC to assemble Rice Meal Packs for Midwest Mission. Together, a number of churches paid \$6,500 to assemble 3,000 bags for 18,000 meals! We received this message from Midwest Mission:

Your supplies were shipped on our 29th shipment of the year. This container went to Guatemala on October 24, 2024!

The container weighed 23,807 lbs. and its value was \$182,032.50. Midwest Mission disbursed medical supplies, pillow cases, blankets, diapers, washcloths, onesies, shower chairs, wheelchairs, tarps, toys, sewing machines, hospital beds, mattresses, coolers, Rice Meals, and Personal Dignity Kits.

This shipment was sent through our partner Food For The Poor (FFTP). FFTP serves 17 countries in Latin America and the Caribbean. Because of your donations, people around the world have the supplies they need to live a hope-filled, healthy life.

Thank you to all our donors and mission volunteers who purchased and assembled these essential kits that show God's love in a practical way. Every kit assembled at Midwest Mission is made by a volunteer. Without your dedication, we would not be able to continue to help others.

Thanks so much for sending hope and empowerment around the world and around the corner.

Many of us would like to have a Rice Meal Pack event at River of Life. As you can see above, it is costly. We have begun a fund and will schedule the event when we have raised half of the money needed. You can donate online or write "Rice Meal Kit Event" on your check.
